

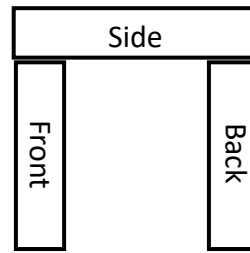
Cutting Dimensions

Door	4 ½ x 10	11.4 x 25.5

Written Instructions

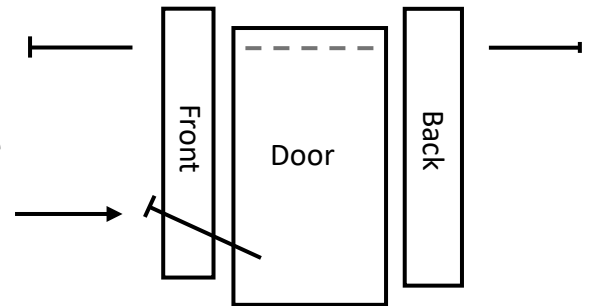
1. Start by attaching the Side to the edge of the Back.
2. Now attach Side to the edge of the Front. Should look like a "U" with the Side on the very bottom.
3. Attach the Floor to all three of these pieces.
4. Attach Door: hammer in just two nails (not screws!) at the top, so it can pivot out. Make sure there's a very thin gap at the top or it will catch on the roof and won't pivot properly.
5. The lock nail keeps the "door" closed. On the diagram, is the Pin Method. Hammer a nail through Front & Door, then remove the nail and widen the holes. That allows the nail to be easy to insert or remove.
6. Attach the Roof so it overhangs the front. This stops the crows from being able to reach in.

Both Front & Back are on the INSIDE edge of the Side

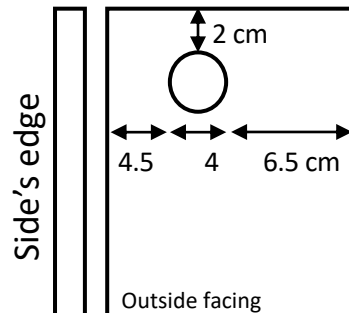
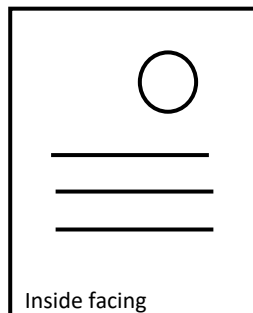
Side view



Notes on Front Piece

Scoring lines below the entrance helps the birds to crawl out.

Make sure it faces inside so predators don't get in!



Make sure to off-centre the entrance hole. Not doing this makes it look lopsided with Side A added.

Notes on Cleaning

Active nest boxes should be cleaned out in the winter! Having the inside accessible makes this process a breeze.

Wearing gloves, just remove the nesting material. If there are signs of parasites, then give the inside a quick spray of 5% bleach solution.
